Of course, this year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the event was handled a little differently and generous donors went to an online shopping site to purchase selected items. Those items were delivered directly to our community partner agency, PARACHUTE: Butler County CASA. Handling the collection in this manner helped to reduce the possibility of spreading the virus.

In addition to the Teddy Bear drive, individuals and corporate donors adopted families who needed a little extra help during this holiday season. Toys, clothing, coats, gloves, cards and

food items exceeding 1000 items were donated for these families in addition to cash donations of nearly \$2,000, used to purchase additional items for these families. The gifts received for the adopted families were distributed through Butler County United Way and the Butler County Educational Resource Center.

Emily White, Program Supervisor of the Help Me Grow Home Visiting program commented, "This time of year always brings an extra level of stress. But for families who do not have the resources to provide gifts for their children during the holidays, it is far worse. We are forever grateful to those individual and corporate donors who provided these gifts to those less fortunate. In fact, we were able to triple the number of families served this year due to these generous donors!"
