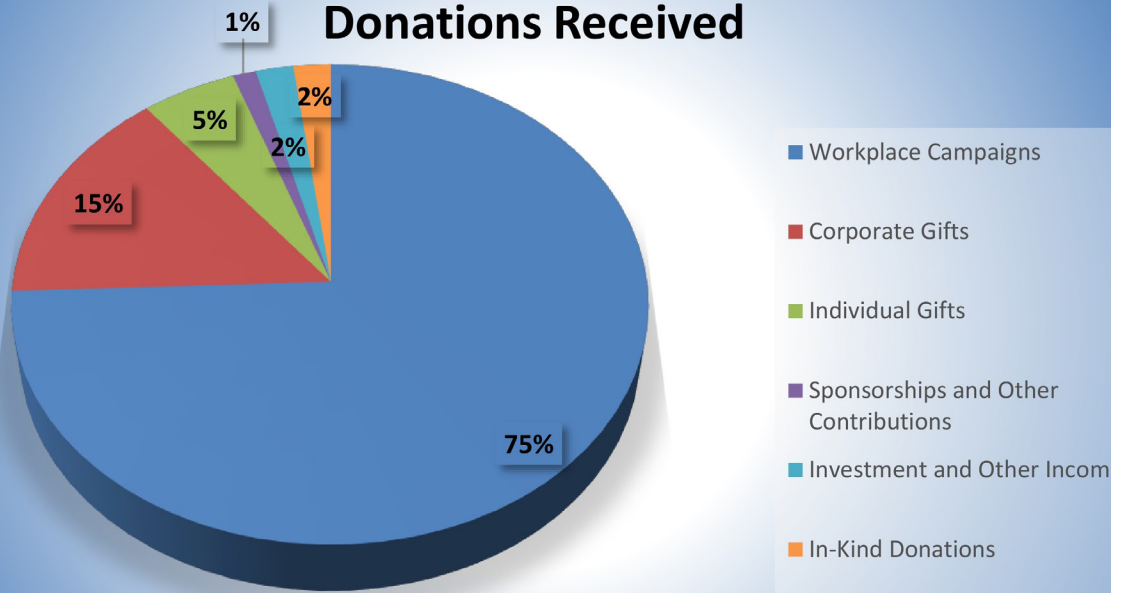

Where donations originated...



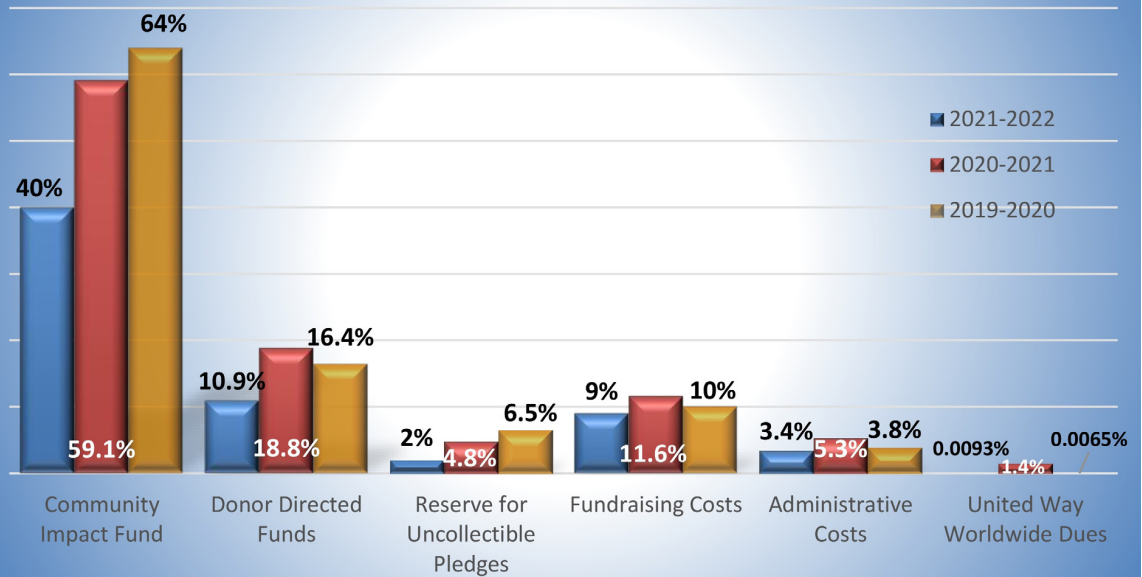
## Donations Received
