Congratulations to our longtime Community Partner, Shared Harvest Foodbank, the winner of the 2025 Spirit of Collaboration Award. Shared Harvest understands what Community Partnership means to Butler County United Way, and uses the strength of that relationship to mutually grow our impact year after year. They were an integral partner in developing the Comprehensive Hunger Relief program and co-hosted our Macaroni Madness Volunteer Event that followed

our breakfast, where 2,648 bags of pasta were portioned for distribution throughout Butler County communities.

That equals out to be 4,413 total meals that were packaged by the 100 Butler County volunteers at this event, and later distributed to families in Butler County facing food insecurity. The volunteer team to pack the most boxes was Duke Energy, our sponsor, with 516 bags of macaroni packed. That's a lot of pasta!

# COMMUNITY PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: COMMUNITY BUILDING INSTITUTE MIDDLETOWN

Since 2009, Community Building Institute Middletown, Inc. (CBI) has been a powerful force for change in the Middletown community. With a mission centered on cradle-to-career success, CBI has connected more than 1,100 families to early education opportunities and serves over 300 students annually through afterschool programs and summer camps. From birth to career, CBI supports residents through early literacy initiatives, K–12 academic support, enrichment programs, post-graduation career planning, and workforce development for under- and unemployed adults. Their doors are open to all who seek opportunity, support, and connection.

CBI's work is powered by a committed team of over 40 full-time, part-time, and seasonal staff who are united by a bold vision:

transforming Middletown one student, one family, and one neighborhood at a time. In addition to direct services, CBI plays a critical convening and coordination role, working with local schools, community partners, and funders—including Butler County United Way, the Ohio Department of Education, the City of Middletown, and generous private donors and foundations.

At the heart of CBI's efforts is its home base, the Robert "Sonny" Hill Community Center. This vital neighborhood anchor is currently undergoing an exciting \$5.6 million transformation. The renovation includes an exterior and interior facelift, and the construction of a brand-new 9,067 square foot gymnasium, and 3,428 square foot early literacy center. The project is on schedule to be completed in October 2025. The Community Center will continue to serve as a safe haven for youth, a gathering space for community groups, and a hub of resources for those in need. Visitors are welcome this summer during the center's operating hours of 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Walk-throughs and tours are encouraged.




### UNITE + DIVIDE: COUNTY-WIDE MONTHLY DRAWING!
