<u>Education Building Block Event:</u> EDGE Teen Center will host a "Financial Literacy Day" aimed at teaching teens about personal finances as well as saving and managing money. This event will take place on Wednesday, November 9, 2016, from 3:00 – 5:00 PM at EDGE Teen Center, 7568 Wyandot Lane in Liberty Township, OH 45044. Center is a non-profit organization in Liberty Township dedicated to helping teens become the best version of themselves, by nurturing character, positive values and leadership qualities. EDGE's programs serve an average of 106 teens each day. Income Stability/Basic Needs Building Block Event: In collaboration with American Red Cross, on Saturday, November 12, 2016, between 9:00 AM and 12:00 PM, 30 Express Scripts volunteers will concentrate in the Fairfield area along Pleasant Avenue, to install free smoke detectors in households with the intention of keeping families and children safe. American Red Cross volunteers will give prior notification of this smoke detector installation several days in advance. <u>Health Building Block Event:</u> Also on Saturday, November 12, 2016, between 9:00 AM and 12:00 PM, FedEx Freight volunteers from Fairfield will be at The Father's House (New Oaks Community) in Hamilton, Ohio. These volunteers will be helping to physically restore the home/orphanage, originally built in 1876, by painting rooms, building the framework for the outside wrap around porch, as well as working on the landscaping. The Father's House is a support system that provides wrap around services for families and others wanting to foster and/or adopt, ensuring that the families and children have healthy lifestyles.
